Workshop: Part Two – Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE)

1. TOWN OPERATIONS

The Town's operations that may include illicit discharges (non-stormwater discharges) include:

five-year permit from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), authorizing the discharge of stormwater runoff from the Town into adjacent Waters of the United States (public waters)

- The first five-year term permit required the Town to initiate and implement a public education and public participation program on the control of pollution from storm water runoff
- The permit also required the Town to prepare storm sewer maps of the urbanized areas of the Town and to conduct a field survey of illicit discharges (non-stormwater discharges) in these areas
- Part of the program included a pollution prevention staff training program for the Town's stormwater-related operations
- In the first five years, the Town was also required to adopt local laws to address pollution from construction-related activities and illicit discharges
- The first five-year term permit ended on January 8, 2008
- The second two-year permit started on May 1, 2008 and ends on April 30, 2010

3. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY

Under current local laws adopted by the Town, New York State permit coverage is required of all construction activities involving a land disturbance of one acre or more in the Town, by:

- Filing an NOI with DEC before starting
- Preparing a SWPPP
- Implementing the SWPPP during construction
- Inspecting construction sites
- Maintaining post-construction practices
